Judging & Awards

Before judging commences all exhibit cards are turned over so that the judges have no knowledge about the identity of exhibitors when making their decisions.

Exhibit cards are marked for exhibits placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class. Judges are under no obligation to award all three places. Judges' decisions are final.

For Vegetables, Fruit and Flowers, Herbs and Plants, judges will take into account the condition, uniformity, size and colour of exhibits when arriving at their decisions. Where necessary the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook or the WI 'On With The Show' Handbook will be consulted for guidance. Both these handbooks give valuable guidance to exhibitors and are available for purchase from the RHS or WI. The RHS Handbook is also available at St Ives library.

Any disputes will be decided upon by the Committee. Their decision will be final. The Committee reserves the right to combine or amend classes or sections when considering the number of entries received.

The winners of Section and Best in Show prizes are decided on total points, three points being awarded for 1st place in a class, two for 2nd and one point for 3rd place. Where there is a tie the exhibitor with the highest number of 1st places will be declared the winner.

Awards will be made as shown below. All awards are for the winners to keep, other than the Billman Rosebowl and Holmes Trophy, both of which must be returned a month before the following year's show for a medal to be attached to the base with the winner's name and year. Winners of these two awards must sign a declaration regarding their safekeeping and return.

Exhibit cards will be marked with 1st, 2nd or 3rd for the exhibitor to keep. Judges may sometimes add a comment.

The winner of each section (e.g. Vegetables) will be awarded a small trophy to keep. For the Children's Section certificates will also be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places.

The Billman Rosebowl

Awarded to the winner of the Flower Arranging Section.

The Holmes Trophy

Awarded to the Best in Show exhibitor, based on the total points gained in all classes in the show.

The Banksian Medal

Awarded to the exhibitor with the most points in sections 1,2 and 3. Any exhibitor who has won the award in either of the two previous years is not eligible.

The Waitrose Prize

Awarded by a Waitrose manager based on the individual entries that most catch their eye. The winner will receive vouchers to the value of £30 (1st place), second and third will receive £20 and £10 respectively.

People's Choice

There will also be a People's Choice vote on the day for the Art, Craft and Photography sections with a prize voucher donated by Escape and Create.

St Ives Gardening Club

A £25 gardening voucher will be awarded by their judge for their favourite entry in Section 3.

Show guidance

Exhibitors should carefully follow the guidance given in this schedule, especially that set out below and under each section. Any exhibit which does not follow the guidance may be judged as not according to schedule and will be ineligible for an award. Examples are: displaying more or fewer items than requested, incorrect size or weight, incorrect preservation of preserves or decoration of cakes, inappropriate mounting of artwork or photographs or enhancing of images.

All vegetables and flowers exhibited must be grown by the exhibitor unless otherwise stated. All other exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.

Entrants for children's classes must be aged 12 years or under on the day of the show. The age of the child will be stated on the exhibit cards.

Up to three items per class per exhibitor will be accepted, unless otherwise stated. If more than one exhibit is entered in any vegetable, fruit, flower, herb or plant class each entry must be of a different variety. For other classes a clear description of each exhibit is required to demonstrate that no multiple entries are identical (e.g. if two soft fruit jam exhibits are entered each must be a different type).

The entry form has space for the variety or description to be entered. Even where there is only a single exhibit entered the exhibitor should if possible provide the variety or description since this will be shown on the exhibit card for the benefit of visitors to the show.

Paper plates will be provided where suitable. Exhibitors must supply their own vases.

The Committee will not be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibitor's property. All reasonable care will be taken to protect exhibits.

Section 1 Vegetables and Herbs Sponsored by

Exhibits should be clean, fresh, mature of uniform size, free from blemishes, without pest or disease damage and displayed evenly. Stalks and calyces should be fresh and intact, unless otherwise specified. Natural bloom of the skin should be intact and of good colour.

Entries may be of any variety, but all items on the plate must be of the same variety unless otherwise specified.

For 1.14 & 1.15 potatoes should be medium sized and washed. Additionally, for 1.14 the skin should be all white. For 1.20, a truss is defined as a compact cluster of tomatoes growing on one stalk. For 1.24, the vegetables displayed must not be mentioned in any other class and the number displayed should be comparable to similarly sized vegetables in other classes. For 1.25 there should be 6 different vegetables, maximum number of items being 16.

Section 3 Flowers & Plants Sponsored by

Flowers should be displayed unadorned in plain uncoloured or single coloured vases with clean water. All exhibits should be free from pest, disease or weather damage. Dead flowers or foliage should be removed.

All exhibits must have been raised by the exhibitor from seed or been bought at least six months before the show date. 3.12 may contain moss.

Section 4 Flower Arranging Sponsored by

Flowers and foliage need not be grown by the exhibitor. No artificial plant material is allowed. Arrangements may include accessories, but natural plant materials must predominate. Flower arrangements may include foliage. All arrangements must be contained within an area 45 x 45 cm.

Section 5 Preserves & Produce Sponsored b

All exhibits must be presented in well-sealed, clean and colourless jars. Contents must be clearly described upon clean labels.

Pickles and chutneys should be at least two months old.

Jams, jellies and marmalades should be filled to the top of the jar to allow for shrinkage and covered with a wax disc if using cellophane jam pot covers. Mixed fruit jams should be entered under the class of the predominant fruit.

Section 6 Baking Sponsored by

For classes 6.01 and 6.02 the dough may be made in a machine, but the bread must be finished by hand and baked in an oven. The use of premixed ingredient products is strictly forbidden in all classes.

The ingredients for 6.04 are 220g self-raising flour, 25-50 g sugar, 25-50g margarine, 25-50g sultanas, 125ml Milk, 1 level tsp salt. Please display 4.

Section 7 Home Brewing, Wine and Liqueurs Sponsored by

Wine must not be made from a commercial kit. Entries should be presented in a 75cl bottle of clean, polished glass and sealed with a flanged cork.

Red wine - Alcohol 12% to 15%, acidity 0.45% to 0.65%.

White wine -Alcohol 10% to 13.5%, acidity 0.5% to 0.8%.

Beer and cider - 500ml glass bottle sealed with a screw, swing or crown top.

Fruit liqueur and fruit cordial - glass bottle, maximum size 75cl, with a screw top. The bottle contents must be clearly labelled stating class, description, type (primary ingredient for wines) and year (when made).
